I'll tell you pointblank, Shippensburg is a pain is my tail right now without alcohol. What you say is nice, and if we was living with Shirley Temple still on TV, it would probably still work but that don't happen no more. Realistically I can tell you 2011 -- school is only open what, eight months out of the I had 161 incidents at Sheetz, 161. Twenty one were alcohol related, 42 were retail theft and -- excuse me, in that amount of time. Your service now between 10 and 2 stinks. You don't have enough people. Kids standing around out there waiting for food. While they're waiting for food they're stealing stuff off the shelf. They're grabbing ladies by the tail end. They're doing everything else they ain't got no business doing because they're waiting for your food because you don't have enough people now, so I'm supposed to assume you're going to have more people when you're selling alcohol. I beg to differ. For the last three years my officers -council has given money -- CDBG money to put extra patrols.

For the last three years I have had patrols sit at Jiffy Lube or Sheetz waiting for calls, for a response, and if you go

down there, Council, now and look at night between 10 and 3, see how many family people go in that store, see how many people from the community there are in that store, none of them.

My wife comes home and complains to me about that. And your security, it stinks. I'm a man. I'm going to tell you straight up. I called a year ago to talk to your lady in charge of security. You know what, haven't heard from her yet. You hired a security guard down there. He tried to do his job. He got grief. What kind of security guard are you going to bring down there, a cheap one, one armed or one going to do something or one going to walk around like the one you just had that walked around with his buddies, walked around like he was lost in la la land. When your people don't — it's nice to say what your people are going to do, but once that Sheetz is built when will we see you again?

MR. CAMPBELL: Actually I live in the area.

CHIEF SCOTT: At Sheetz, when will we see you at Sheetz as an employee?

MR. CAMPBELL: You'll see me quite often in this area. As a matter of fact, I was the district manager for this area years ago. I actually was the DM because I worked this store.

To answer your question, I've been there at

night. I worked with these kids. I know what it's about.

I'm ten minutes from this particular location. So, again,
when this does open, I will be there. You will see me.
You will see the security people in that store, and if you
have a problem with the security and it's not doing what
they're supposed to do, call me. I'm actually in charge of
it.
